Presentation: Beneath the Surface: Technical examination of genre paintings at the Mauritshuis Abbie Vandivere

Dr. Vandivere will present some technical information that was gathered for the forthcoming catalogue *Genre Painting in the Mauritshuis*. The museum's paintings conservators have examined 84 works by 41 artists. They investigated whether it was possible to draw a parallel between technique and the subject matter that distinguishes 'high' and 'low' genre paintings (*burgerlijke genre* and *boerengenre*). Similarities and differences between each part of the layer structure – the support, preparatory layers, underdrawing and the paint layers – will be discussed.

Presentation: Humour in Genre Paintings Elmer Kolfin

Dr. Kolfin will elaborate on the correlation between iconography and technique, then will discuss humour in genre paintings.

Exhibition:At Home in Holland:Vermeer and his Contemporaries from the British Royal Collection

A royal visit from Great Britain: in the autumn of 2016, the Mauritshuis will exhibit a selection of seventeenth-century Dutch paintings from the British Royal Collection. The selection contains representations of daily life as depicted by painters of the Dutch Golden Age, and offers an exceptional chance to see over twenty masterpieces from the Royal Collection, the largest loan of paintings to a Dutch museum to date. The Royal Collection, held in trust by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, contains unique highlights from the oeuvres of famous painters such as Gerard ter Borch, Pieter de Hooch, Gabriel Metsu, and Jan Steen. The highlight of the exhibition is *The Music Lesson* by Johannes Vermeer. *At Home in Holland* will be on view at the Mauritshuis until 8 January 2016.
