

• New blog online by Marieke Hendriksen en Ruben Verwaal: 'The "Gentle Heat" of Boerhaave's Little Furnace'. With the introduction of chemistry into the university curriculum in the late seventeenth century, new practical needs arose for students, such as being able to perform experiments. Would it be possible to build a chemical furnace that provides a gentle heat, yields no smoke, and is safe for students to use? Herman Boerhaave (1668–1738) believed he found the perfect solution in, what came to be called, Boerhaave's little furnace.

• Panel session HSS: Sven Dupré will organize an Expertise in Art and Science panel session during the History of Science Society annual meeting, which will be held in Seattle from 1-4 November 2018. The session focuses on the development of a science-based conservation practice and the emergence of art history as a 'science of art' (or Kunstwissenschaft) in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. In his paper, Sven Dupré will discuss how X-rays changed the practice of art history. ARTECHNE PhD student Mariana Pinto will also present a paper in this panel, titled 'Chemists in the Field of Archaeology: Pigment Analysis of Paint Samples in Nineteenth-Century England'.

- Job opportunity: The Urban Studies Institute (USI) at the University of Antwerp, Belgium, conducts interdisciplinary research on urbanization and urban issues, and is currently looking for two full-time visiting scholars for a short term research stay from 1 January 2019. The selected scholars will be offered the opportunity to conduct their research at the USI and to participate at the institute's research activities. - Symposium: On 8 and 9 November 2018, the Rijksmuseum will host an international symposium on the history of conservation of paintings by Rembrandt van Rijn. The aim is to heighten awareness of how the appearance and condition of paintings by Rembrandt can (partly) be explained by their treatment history. The symposium is organised on the occasion of the research and treatment of the portraits of Marten Soolmans and Oopjen Coppit by Rembrandt van Rijn, jointly owned by the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam and the Musée du Louvre in Paris. Early bird registration closes on 13 September 2018.
